FROM THE RECTORY

ON ANIMAL COMPANIONSHIP

My Christmas present came early this year, in the form of a new poodle puppy, the great-granddaughter of our beloved dog, Dagmar, who died last August. As many of you may know, Dagmar was a companion to me not only at home, but at my office and on many visits.

Juniper Bleu arrived at our home on November 27, a 10-week old, blue standard poodle who immediately won our hearts. In the months between Dagmar's death and Juniper's arrival, I really missed having a dog companion. In my experience, there is something about the presence of animals that enriches our human lives in a very deep way.

For the last few months, Bibi and I have been reading stories by author James Herriot. For those of you who do not already know Herriot's work, he was a veterinarian in England who wrote many stories about his life and work; his best known book is *All Creatures Great and Small*.

Reading these stories to Bibi has been my first introduction to Herriot's work. I have found his stories lovely and am amazed that they also hold Bibi's attention, as much of the language is in a more formal British English (though her exposure to Harry Potter has given her a great background in this tongue!). Last night, we read a story about Herriot's dog, Sam, who accompanied Herriot on many of his veterinary visits. His articulation of what it meant for him to have a dog companion echoes my own feelings:

Having Sam with me added so much to the intermissions I granted myself on my daily rounds. Whereas in offices and factories they had tea breaks, I just stopped the car and stepped out into the splendor which was always at hand and walked for a spell down hidden lanes, through woods, or, as today, over one of the grassy tracks which ran over the high tops. I like my fellow men, but there are times when it is wonderful to be utterly alone in a wide landscape. Here I can find peace and tranquility.

The thing which I had always done now had new meaning to me. Anybody who has ever walked a dog knows the abiding satisfaction which comes from giving pleasure to a loved animal, and the sight of the little form trotting ahead of me lent a depth which had been missing before.

SERVICE TRIP TO BATON ROUGE, LA

From October 22–29 a work crew from our parish flew to Baton Rouge to be gutting houses ravaged by August's massive flooding in the entire area surrounding Baton Rouge, Louisiana. An estimated 45,000–100,000 homes were flooded affecting over 500,000 residents. Only a quarter of those who have lost their homes have flood insurance. While there we worked on four different homes. Four people went from our parish, two more from our community, one from Tallahassee, Florida and one from Austin, Texas.

We worked for two full days mucking out wet insulation and piles of debris that were still in and around Miss Amanda's mobile home. She has been displaced to her uncle's home with her partner and three children and their pets. Then on to Miss Mary's home, removing a huge pile of debris from her home to the end of an uphill driveway. Very grueling for us old folks. On Wednesday, we spent the day removing linoleum and carpet from Herbert's home and cleaning up silt from his tile floors in three large rooms. This was all done with wire brushes on our hands and knees. The last day we tore out sheetrock from Randy's home so that another crew could come in and remove mold that had grown there. All very hard work but very rewarding. We really felt like we were doing God's work once again and we give thanks for opportunity to serve Him by serving His people. Thank you all for your support.

DIAPER SUNDAY

Many thanks for the generosity of those parishioners who donated diapers on Diaper Sunday. I am very pleased to report that St. Michael's Episcopal Church has donated 3,322 diapers to the very new Diaper Bank at Parks Place, a Community Resource Center in Bellows Falls serving all of Windham County. They are the first diaper bank in the state of Vermont. They thank you and your Outreach Team thanks you as well.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

A huge THANK YOU to all who have contributed to the 2017 Stewardship Campaign. In October, we set a stretch goal of raising \$245,000 and receiving 130 pledges. As of December 13, we met our first goal. We have received 119 pledges for a total of \$246,706. We are still hoping to reach our pledge number goal and hope if you haven't pledged, you will do so soon. Meeting our pledge goal allows St. Michael's to fund the current ministries of our church. Surpassing our goal will allow St. Michael's to depend less on its endowment draw (which was 3%) in 2016 to save more for St. Michael's future and give St. Michael's the means to grow new ministries. We are so grateful for your generosity and your support.

ADULT EDUCATION FORUMS FOR JANUARY 2017:

Our forums are held most Sundays from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. in the upstairs meeting room. Everyone is invited, and visitors are especially welcome.

January 1: No Forum

January 8: Paul's Ordination: What was that about?!

Thad Bennett will facilitate a conversation about how the St. Michael's community came to be part of the Rev. Paul Moberly's ordination to the deaconate. What role did the community play? Why does it matter? Who is this Paul guy anyway? Does someone have to be ordained to "do ministry" or is there a process anyone can follow to "find their call?" Join us for this lively conversation which will both help us know how we got to this place with Paul — who will be with us - and what such a journey might mean for any Christian.

January 15: Dr. Dottie Morris, Director of Multiculturalism and Diversity at Keene State College, will lead the Adult Form. Her topic is,

"How do we teach our young people about issues of racism, diversity and justice? How can the Church help?" January 22: Devin Starlanyl will lead a forum on Fibromyalgia and Chronic Myofascial Pain and Dysfunction. Sometimes disability is not what we expect, and some patients don't fit into well-known labels. You may not know what to do for those of us with these invisible illnesses, and may inadvertently hurt us with actions and words that mean to be helpful. Learn a little about Devin's baptismal ministry and these conditions, the role of pain and spirituality, and how you can better help those in your congregation and in your lives.

January 29: Reflections on the Women's March the day after the Inauguration. On January 21, 8–12 members of St. Michael's Church will be walking together at the Women's March in Washington DC. The purpose of the March is to "stand together in solidarity with our partners and children for the protection of our rights, our safety, our health, and our families — recognizing that our vibrant and diverse communities are the strength of our country." This forum is an opportunity for participants from St. Michael's to share experiences and thoughts about the March and where we go from here.

MARTIN LUTHER KING SUNDAY, JANUARY 15, 2017

St. Michael's Church welcomes Dr. Dottie Morris to preach at the 10:15 a.m. service and lead the Adult Forum at 9:00 a.m.

Dr. Dottie Morris has been Chief Officer for Diversity and Multiculturalism at Keene College since 2008. Dr. Morris will speak about Martin Luther King's dream and vision were he to be speaking to us today. The liturgy and readings will celebrate King's life and vision.

Dr. Morris will also lead the Adult Forum focusing promoting diversity in our own families and life around us. Maya Angelou: *"It is time for parents to teach young people early on that in diversity there is beauty and there is strength.*"



As Chief Officer for Diversity and Multiculturalism, Dr. Morris recommends institutional practices and policies that foster a welcoming and inclusive campus community. She reports directly to the president, and provides support and resources to the College's deans, commissions, department chairs, administrators, staff, and students in matters related to the advancement of the College's goals for diversity and multiculturalism. In

Brattleboro, Dottie served as the Associate Dean for Student Learning at World Learning School for International Training (SIT) Institute.


