ADULT FORUM, 9 – 10 AM on SUNDAY MORNINGS

• This Sunday, January 22 -- Devin Starlanyl will lead a forum on Fibromyalgia and Chronic Myofascial Pain and Dysfunction. Sometimes disability is not what we expect, and some patients don't fit into well-known labels. You may not know what to do for those of us with these invisible illnesses, and may inadvertently hurt us with actions and words that mean to be helpful. Learn a little about Devin's baptismal ministry and these conditions, the role of pain and spirituality, and how you can better help those in your congregation and in your lives.

• January 29 -- Reflections on the Women's March – the day after the Inauguration. On Jan 21, 8-12 members of St. Michael's Church will be walking together at the Women's March in Washington DC. The purpose of the March is to "stand together in solidarity with our partners and children for the protection of our rights, our safety, our health, and our families – recognizing that our vibrant and diverse communities are the strength of our country." This forum is an opportunity for participants from St. Michael's to share experiences and thoughts about the March and where we go from here.


