St Michael's Choir (begins this Sunday)

28 amazing adults and 7experienced teenagers currently form the St. Michael's choir. We rehearse weekly on Sunday mornings at 8:45-10:15, with additional evening rehearsals scheduled throughout the season in preparation for major programs. Although there are no formal auditions for the choir, prior musical experience and music literacy skills are recommended.

The Choir School Programs (starting on Thursday, September 19)

- Teen Choir School: for singers 13-18, meets Thursday at 4:45-5:45. Prior musical experience highly recommended. This group will continue to expand musical skills in harmony, leadership, and ensemble.
- The Choir School: for singers 8-12, meets Thursday at 3:45-4:30 (social/snack time starting at 3:30). This group forms the foundation for building strong musical skills in areas of vocal production, music literacy, and interpretation and musicality. New singers are welcome!
- NEW: Little Squeaks: for beginning singers, 5-7, meets Thursday at 3:45-4:45 (social/snack time starting at 3:30). Choir School Alum Extraordinaire Jayne Fritz leads this group in song, movement, rhythm, and story.

Diocesan Consecration Choir (Saturday, September 28)

- Even if you are not currently singing in one of the St. Michael's Choir programs, you are welcome to join others from across Vermont in a consecration choir that will sing in celebration of the consecration of Shannon MacVean-Brown as Bishop of Vermont.
