"PERSONAL DISCERNMENT IN A TIME OF GREAT CHANGE" COURSE, FINAL MEETING THIS MONDAY, MAY 25, 6-7 PM, ALL WELCOME: The world has changed. How do we stay connected to God's call to us so that the changes required of us bring us closer to God? How do we prayerfully discern our role in creating a new beginning?

This is an invitation to join lay and clergy leaders at St. Michael's to learn and practice discernment exercises from the Ignatian tradition. They have been teaching and practicing these exercises in the parish for more than two years based largely on Mark Thibodeaux's *God's Voice Within,* woven together with their training in Centering Prayer, Soulcraft, and organizational leadership.

The online Zoom course is a 3-part series from 6 -7 pm with an option to remain online longer for informal reflection and sharing. **Anyone may join for this session,** whether you have or have not attended any of the previous two sessions. The session will include a brief teaching about an element of Ignatian discernment, time for a practical exercise, and opportunity for shared reflection. There will be optional "homework" after each session. At the end of the course, participants will have a grasp of basic concepts of Ignatian spirituality and practical decision-making tools. Support is needed at the Southern Vermont Correctional Facility, the state prison in Springfield, where St. Michael's has hosted monthly non-denominational religious services, suspended now due to Covid-19. The Volunteer Services Coordinator there says it is a difficult time now that special programs and services have had to be suspended due to the pandemic.

She asks for help in providing prizes for BINGO, which is offered 3 times a week for each unit. Prizes like bottles of shampoo or body wash *in clear bottle*s, soap, and toothpaste would be much appreciated. Any donations of these items can be left at St. Michael's and Cliff Wood will pick them up and deliver them to the prison on May 25. There is a container with a blue top on the bench in front of the entrance to the offices.

Also, some prisoners are being released and don't have clothes other than their sweats. Thrift stores, where clothing used to be available to prisoners, are no longer open. If you are willing to provide clothing for a prisoner being released, let Cliff know and he will put you in touch with the Volunteer Coordinator.
