
Order of Worship

Psalm 107:1-9 read responsively by whole verse

- 1 Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, * and his mercy endures for ever.
- 2 Let all those whom the LORD has redeemed proclaim * that he redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
- 3 He gathered them out of the lands; * from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
- 4 Some wandered in desert wastes; * they found no way to a city where they might dwell.
- 5 They were hungry and thirsty; * their spirits languished within them.

- 6 Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, * and he delivered them from their distress.
- 7 He put their feet on a straight path * to go to a city where they might dwell.
- 8 Let them give thanks to the LORD for his mercy * and the wonders he does for his children.
- 9 For he satisfies the thirsty *and fills the hungry with good things.

Reader:

Exodus 16: 11-13, 15, 35

The Lord spoke to Moses and said, "I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God.'" When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "What is it?" Moses said to them, "It is the bread the Lord has given you to eat." The Israelites ate manna forty years, until they came to a habitable land; they ate manna, until they came to the border of the land of Ca'naan. **Congregation: Thanks be to God.**

Officiant: Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit;
People: For you have redeemed me, O Lord, O God of truth.
Officiant: Keep us, O Lord, as the apple of your eye;
People: Hide us under the shadow of your wings.


Lord, have mercy. *Christ, have mercy.* Lord, have mercy.

The Officiant then reads a Collect or two for the evening and the invitation to offer intercessions with explanation of the refrain.

Cantor leads the community in the chant refrain three times:



Intercessions from the community and the refrain alternate until everyone who wishes to has had a chance to offer their prayers in the group. Prayers conclude with the chant refrain three times.

Congregation, led by Lector: Guide us waking, O Lord, and guard us sleeping; that awake we may watch with Christ, and asleep we may rest in peace.

Lord, you now have set your servant free to go in peace as you have promised;

For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, whom you have prepared for all the world to see:

A Light to enlighten the nations, and the glory of your people Israel.


Praise to the Holy and Undivided Trinity, one God, As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.
