

Station 1: Jesus is condemned to die


Leader: Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return.

Congregation: Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted.

Scripture: As soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate asked him, 'Are you the King of the Jews?' He answered him, 'You say so.' Then the chief priests accused him of many things. Pilate asked him again, 'Have you no answer? See how many charges they bring against you.' But Jesus made no further reply, so that Pilate was amazed.

Now at the festival he used to release a prisoner for them, anyone for whom they asked... [Pilate asked] them, 'Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?' But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas [a murderer] for them instead. Pilate spoke to them again, 'Then what do you wish me to do with the man you call the King of the Jews?' They shouted back, 'Crucify him!' Pilate asked them, 'Why, what evil has he done?' But they shouted all the more, 'Crucify him!' So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified.

Station 2: Jesus is denied by Peter

Leader: Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my restless thoughts; Congregation: see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

"Simon son of John, do you love me?"

While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant-girls saw Peter warming himself and said, "You are with Jesus, the man from Nazareth." But he denied it, saying, "I do not know or understand what you are talking about."

"Simon son of John, do you love me?"

She began again to say to the bystanders, "This man is one of them." But again he denied it.

"Simon son of John, do you love me?"



Station 3: Jesus takes up his cross

Leader: For this reason the Father loves me Congregation: because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged. And the soldiers wove a crown out of thorns and placed it on his head, and clothed him in a purple cloak, and they came to him and said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck him repeatedly... They took Jesus, and carrying the cross himself he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha.

I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

They pressed into service a passer-by, Simon, a Cyrenian, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross.


Station 5: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem

Leader: Simeon said to Mary, "this child is destined to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed.

Congregation: And a sword shall pierce your own side also."

A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children, for indeed, the days are coming when people will say, 'Blessed are the barren, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.' At that time, people will say to the mountains, 'Fall upon us!' and to the hills, 'Cover us!' for if these things are done when the wood is green what will happen when it is dry

Station 6: Jesus is crucified


Leader: See, my servant shall prosper; he shall be exalted and lifted up, and shall be very high. Congregation: he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.

They crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide what each should take.

It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. The inscription of the charge against him read, 'The King of the Jews.' And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying, 'Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself, and come down from the cross!'

Station 7: Jesus entrusts Mary and John to each other


Leader: Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. Congregation: The command we have from him is this – those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.


Station 8: Jesus dies on the cross

Leader: What greater love is there than this, to lay down one's life for his friends. Congregation: You are my friends if you keep my commandments.

When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah." And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"


Station 9: Jesus is laid in the tomb


Leader: Is your steadfast love declared in the grave Congregation: or your faithfulness in the land of destruction?

When evening had come, and since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath, Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he had been dead for some time. When he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Jesus saw where the body was laid.

- 17 Your blazing anger has swept over me; * your terrors have destroyed me;
- 18 They surround me all day long like a flood; * they encompass me on every side.
