






The Presider asks the Holy Spirit to consecrate the bread and the wine to be God's holy food.


And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,


God of abundance,

STM INTERFAITH REFUGEE MINISTRY UPDATES, NOVEMBER 24, 2021: The outpouring of interest in the Refugee Ministry has been humbling. There are offers of help and questions about how each of us can help. We are blessed with the necessary passion and commitment around this humanitarian project. Thanks to all for your contributions to date.

As of today, November 23:

- We are anticipating our first family(s) somewhere between December 13 and the end of the year 2021 so we are deep into the process of preparing. The Federal Government has halted further regular refugee placement until the Afghans, still in "Safe Harbor" military bases here in this country, are placed. (There are still approximately 50,000 needing placement.) Thus, the family(s) we receive for the next 3-6 months will most likely be our Afghan brothers and sisters.
- Two upcoming very strategic events in our preparation phase are:
 - Household Goods Sorting Party; Sunday, November 28, at 3PM-5PM, in the Undercroft.
 - Core Group Training with ECDC, Saturday, December 4; time and place TBD.

We are going to need all the support our great congregation can deliver. You have asked how you can help. The Refugee Ministry Team has heard this loud and clear. We are thankful for your interest and energy.

Immediate Opportunities to Participate and Assist:

- 1. The St Michael's Refugee Co-Sponsorship Core Group is in need of some younger helpers to move furniture and other heavier and larger objects around as we prepare for the arrival of our new Vermonters. It's a bonus if you have the use of a truck. We will need help now through the end of the year and, on most occasions, we will phone you the day before, asking whether you're available for an hour or two. - 2. In-Kind Needs List; As we gather clothing and furnishing for our Afghan family, we continue to have items in short supply.
