

#### READING FROM THE EARLY CHURCH

Hebrews 10:5-10

The purpose of Jesus' coming into the world—to make an offering in his body for our sanctification.

When Christ came into the world, he said,

"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me;

in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Following the Peace, the Celebrant recites a sentence from Holy Scripture; all prepare for the Holy Eucharist.








The Presider asks the Holy Spirit to consecrate the bread and the wine to be God's holy food.


And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

**PROJECT FEED GOES THROUGH DECEMBER 31:** Project Feed the Thousands is unique in that EVERYONE can participate in some way. Whether you choose to make a cash contribution, pick up an extra non-perishable food item every time you go grocery shopping, or order from Amazon, you are helping your friends and neighbors fill a critical gap – the need for the most basic of human needs – food!! There is a bin in the Common Room for dropping off items at church.

Loaves and Fishes specifically needs:

- Canned goods, especially with pop top lids: baked beans, beans, canned chicken, tuna fish, deviled ham, hash, fruits, and vegetables, spaghetti sauce;
- Dry goods: crackers, individual packets of rice and mashed potatoes, mac and cheese, pasta meals;
- And of course, cash donations made out to Loaves and Fishes with Project Feed in the memo.
