
LETTER FROM DARCEY & SUSAN

SUMMARY OF NOVEMBER MEETING OF THE VESTRY

Mary provided the Vestry with an update and prayer for Nancy Ames.

Our meeting began, as customary, with Devotional Time. Chris Hart offered a reflection followed by asking the question, "how do we deal with the challenging and dark times we face in our lives?" Our group sharing focused on the practice of prayer.

Bruce provided a monthly and year-to-date Treasurer's Report. His thorough and thoughtful analysis each month is both informative and reassuring. He concluded with "we are definitely meeting our budget and not exceeding expenses." It is hard to think of more reassuring words.

The budget development process for 2023 is getting underway and Bruce stated they would have a draft budget for the December Vestry meeting. Bruce will be available to assist, as needed, Tom Cain, our new Treasurer who will begin in January. Tom will be involved in new budget development.

Minutes of the October Meeting were approved as presented to the Vestry.

RECTOR'S REPORT:

Advent: Mary provided an overview of Advent planning, which will be closer to pre-pandemic activities. There will be a St. Nicholas Day Fair on December 4 after the 10:15 service. The Advent Lessons and Carols will be on Sunday, December 11, at 4:00 pm. The program will be in-person and livestreamed.

There will be a Christmas Pageant at 4 pm on Saturday, December 24, at 4 pm. Many thanks to Annie Landenberger, Lisa Sparrow and Miranda Smith for organizing the children for this family event. There will be Liturgies at 8 pm Christmas Eve and 10 am on Christmas Day. No 8 am service that day.

Music Director's Search: The search is in process with some promising applications. The Choir is meeting to share their input with the search committee. A celebration for Susan Dedell will be held on January 15th.

Bishop's Visit: Bishop Shannon will be visiting the parish on Sunday May 7th. She will be Confirming and Receiving new members into the Church. The Liturgy will be at 11 am. There will be no 10:15 am Liturgy that day. She will meet via Zoom with the Vestry on Wednesday, April 26th.

Nominating Committee: Jared and Mary gave an update on the annual process of replacing three Vestry members who are going off the Board, after their three years of service. They have done some outreach, and we are hopeful that we will have identified three new members by our December meeting.

WARDEN'S REPORT:

Common Room Project: Annie gave an update of the Common Room Project that includes a historical timeline past to present. Community members were invited to participate in providing input on Sunday, November 13th. Mary, adwoa, Annie and designer Chris Triebert are organizing the project. Alan reported that the carpeting for the area will be installed on January 23rd.

Vestry Retreat: dates are set for Friday evening and Saturday, February 24–25th. Details on logistics will follow.

Parish Ministries: Annie asked members to complete write-ups they may be doing on parish ministries. Rebecca's Altar Guild write-up is due December 15 for the January *Guardian* and Rosie's write-up ion Hospitality is due January 15 for the February on *Guardian*. The plan is to consolidate all the write-ups into one document so parishioners can have an easy reference to the many ministries at St. Michael's. Chris reported on this past month's Vestry Listening Corner, sharing one request from a member seeking assistance with an accommodation during Sunday Liturgy. Annie shared from the Communication Committee an article that she prepared that was published in "The Mountain" on St. Michael's Refugee Ministry.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Stewardship: Steve and Mary reported on the progress of this fall's Stewardship Campaign. Both commented how well the preparation and process went. Our thanks to this year's three Sunday speakers, Alex O'Pray, Joyce Vining Morgan and Matthew Elkan. Sunday November 20th is the In-Gathering of Pledges.

Building Hope: Alan provided an update. The roof copper is in and we are all seeing first-hand the progress taking place. Alan said the walk-through by electrician Brian Tyler was fine with plenty of electrical capacity in the building for our needs. Alan said they would be building a catwalk above the insulation in the Bradley Wing in order to access electrical or any other service need.

Cash Flow: Jared reported that all payments are current on the building project and the cash flow is positive.

Hospitality: Rosie said we will need to talk about hospitality for the Annual Meeting on January 29th and we need volunteers to sign up for food/ refreshments for after the Advent lessons and carols. There is a sign-up folder in the Common Room.

Alan McBean offered a closing prayer for the meeting, which ended 15 minutes early to all Vestry members' delight!
