
The people remain standing. The Celebrant faces them and sings



SWORDS TO PLOWSHARES, RETREAT FARM, APRIL 29, 11 AM – 1 PM: St. Michael's, in collaboration with the Windham County Sheriff's Department, the Brattleboro Police Department, and the Windham County NAACP, will sponsor Swords to Plowshares (S2P), a gun safety and violence prevention event, on Saturday, April 29, 11AM to 1 PM at the Retreat Farm, Rte. 30, in Brattleboro. The Rt. Rev. James Curry, Retired Episcopal Bishop Suffragen of Connecticut, a co-founder of Swords to Plowshares, will also lead the Adult Forum and preach at St. Michael's on April 30.

Since its founding in 2017, Swords to Plowshares (https://www.s2pnortheast.org/) has focused on reducing gun violence in communities. The Rt. Rev. Thomas Ely, Retired Episcopal Bishop of Vermont, and Bishop Curry will speak and do in a live demonstration to let all witness the means by which weapons are forged into tools and implements of nurture. Participants can also try a hand at the forging process. Parishioner Cliff Wood, an event co-chair, will offer a look at the garden tools created from weapons and present them to Edible Brattleboro and SUSU Community Farm, both honored for their community service.

The event will close with talks on gun safety by Brattleboro Police Chief Norma Hardy and Windham County Sheriff Mark Anderson with a final response on behalf of communities of faith by Mary Lindquist as well as a Challenge to Community from Bishop Ely.

BUILDING HOPE FOR THE EARTH UPDATE: We have officially completed the "electrification of energy" portion of the Building Hope for the earth project! That means that the majority of our spaces at St. Michael's will no longer be using oil to heat and cool, but rather clean energy from Green Mountain Power.

Now that winter is largely past, the roofers are back to replace the Bradley Wing and Rectory roofs. Insulation will be installed in the Bradley Wing, helping to prevent the leakage of heat and cooling for this part of our building. Finally, in May, the solar panels will be installed on all the south-facing roofs of the sanctuary, Bradley Wing and Rectory. We are so thankful for this wonderful work that helps us bring our building in alignment with our deepest values and stewardship for God's creation.

2023 TAG SALE UPDATE: St. Michael's has been having Tag Sales since 1973! Our event this year is scheduled for Saturday, May 6 and will be raising proceeds for 2 amazing local organizations: Groundworks Collaborative, which helps local unhoused folks with shelter, food, healthcare and social services, and the Windham County Heat Fund, which offers fuel assistance to people who need it.

We have recently begun accepting furniture donations and hope that you will keep the Tag Sale in mind if you have any items you would like to get rid of. Wooden items (tables, chairs, shelves, bed frames [please, no mattresses], etc.), should be actual wood, not particle board, and in decent condition.
