The Service of Light

The Celebrant says

Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Celebrant: Let us pray. O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast, we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The fire is honored with incense. The Paschal Candle is lighted from the newly kindled fire. The members of the congregation then proceed into the church and are seated. The Deacon, bearing the Candle, leads the procession, pausing three times and singing



At the second and third pause, the Versicle and Response is sung successively a step higher.

As the Deacon processes into the church, the members of the congregation seated on the aisle light their candles from the Paschal Candle and then distribute the light to other members of the congregation.

All (who are able) remain standing in the dimmed church while the cantor sings. **The Exsultet**

The Liturgy of the Word

The Celebrant introduces the Scripture readings, saying

Let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, how he saved his people in ages past; and let us pray that our God will bring each of us to the fullness of redemption.

The Congregation is seated for the readings and the psalms.





Ezekiel 36:24-28




All stand. The priest says, Let us pray. (Silence)

Homily

Holy Baptism

All are invited to stand and gather around the baptismal font.

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors I present Caleb Harrison Love Webb to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

I present Michael Colin Hightower to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Priest asks the candidate when presented Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidates I do.

Then the Priest asks the following questions of the candidate.

Question Answer	Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?
Answer	I do.

After they have been presented, the Priest addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Michael and Caleb in their life in Christ?

People. We will.

The Priest then says

Let us join with Caleb and Michael who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Then all stand to say the **Baptismal Covenant**

Priest	Do you believe in God the Father?
People	I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Priest People	Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead

Priest People	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Priest	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
People	I will, with God's help.
Priest	Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
People	I will, with God's help.
Priest People	Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? I will, with God's help.
Priest People	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? I will, with God's help.
Priest	Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People	I will, with God's help.

The Priest then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for Michael and Caleb who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth

Leader	Deliver them O Lord, from the way of sin and death.
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People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Send them into the world in witness to your love.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

The Priest says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen.*

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Priest blesses the water, first saying

The Priest says the Thanksgiving over water.

Baptism

Caleb/Michael, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

Chrismation

Caleb/Michael, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. *Amen.*

Bishop Ely lays hands upon each one and says

Strengthen, O Lord, your servant Michael/Caleb with your Holy Spirit; empower him for your service; and sustain him all the days of his life. *Amen.*

Let us pray.


Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

The Priest says Let us welcome the newly baptized.

The Celebrant chants this announcement three times. The assembly is sprinkled with water to remind people of their baptisms.

All return to their seats. **Post Communion Prayer** After Communion, the Celebrant says Let us pray.

Celebrant and People Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Celebrant blesses the people. The people respond to each petition with a loud "Amen."

May Almighty God, who has redeemed us and made us children through the resurrection of Christ our Savior, bestow upon you the riches of blessing. **Amen.**

May God, who through the water of baptism has raised us from sin into newness of life, make you holy and worthy to be united with Christ for ever. **Amen.**

May God, who has brought us out of bondage to sin into true and lasting freedom in the Redeemer, bring you to your eternal inheritance. Amen.

And the blessing of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you for ever. Amen.
