## GUEST PREACHER AND CELEBRANT FOR MAY 17

On Sunday, May 17, the Reverend Canon Nicholas Porter will be preaching and celebrating at both services at St. Michael's while Mary and her family attend their son Jonah's graduation from UVM. Canon Porter is a Brattleboro resident and the co-founder of Jerusalem Peacebuilders, an interfaith ministry that provides emerging Israeli and Palestinian leaders with the skills, relationships, and confidence they need to be effective agents of change. In 2025 alone, Jerusalem Peacebuilders' programs involved over 14,000 adults and youth.

This former International Chaplain to the Anglican Archbishop in Jerusalem was knighted in the Order of St. John by the British Crown for his work supporting healthcare access in Jerusalem. In 2016, Dwight Hall at Yale University awarded Nicholas and Dorothy the Curran Prize for distinguished public service. Dorothy and Nicholas have been parishioners at St. Michael's since 1994.
